

The Word of the Laird...

I thought it might be good to give some type of "overview" of Matthew's Gospel which we are reading in this year's cycle.

Matthew begins his Gospel with the Genealogy of Jesus, going back to Abraham. Then follows the birth of Jesus, Joseph accepting Mary as his wife, the visit of the magi, inspiring Herod's anger, the trip to Egypt, slaughter of the innocents, the return and settlement in Nazareth. Matthew is drawing heavily on references to Joseph in Genesis, the slaughtering of the male children in Exodus, the Holy Family re-tracing the route of Jacob and his descendants to Egypt and back under Moses.

After the preaching of John the Baptist and Jesus' baptism comes the temptation, the beginning of the ministry in Galilee and the call of the disciples.

What then follows, some authors have suggested, is five "books" somewhat corresponding to the five books of Moses in the Old Testament. Also, it might appear that Matthew is casting Jesus as a new Moses. Each of the "books" in Matthew's Gospel consists of a discourse followed by other events of varying types.

The first book begins with the Sermon on the Mount (chapters 5-7) followed by episodes of healing (8-9). Then comes the Mission Discourse (chapter 10) from which we are now reading. That is followed by events of rejection, some events in which Jesus is at variance with contemporary Jewish practice and some other signs. The third book is Parables of the Kingdom (chapter 13) which is followed by events of rejection, miracles of healing and feeding, Peter's confession and the prediction of the passion and the transfiguration (chapters 14-17). The fourth book is the Community Discourse (chapter 18) which talks of true greatness, the lost sheep, and the parable of the unforgiving servant. That is

followed by Jesus talking about marriage and divorce, blessing the children, the encounter with the rich young man, more healing, the parable of the two sons and the great commandment. The fifth book presents the woes against the pharisees, the lament for Jerusalem and the eschatological discourse, which all leads up to Jesus death and resurrection (chapters 26-28).

I thought that by breaking it down, for when you might be wanting to read the whole Gospel through, this might be helpful in being able to view the alternating sections of discourse and actions.


