

The Word of the Laird ...

Today we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. Each of the evangelists gives a rendering of it. Mark has the heavenly voice address Jesus, "You are my beloved Son." Luke also uses the second person while Matthew uses the third person for the heavenly voice. John's Gospel does not recount the Baptism but has John acknowledging Jesus as the "Lamb of God."

Originally, the feast of the baptism of Jesus was tied in with Epiphany. And it also included the account of changing water into wine at the wedding feast at Cana. In the western rite these came to be observed as separate feasts. In the eastern and orthodox rites they have maintained the closeness of the Epiphany and the Baptism.

I remember one year visiting my parents who had made their home not far from Tampa, Florida. On the feast of Epiphany the news cast presented the Greek Orthodox Bishop at the bay. He said a prayer and then tossed a cross into the water. Thereupon a large number of young men dove into the water to recover the cross. Supposedly the one who did recover it and returned it to the bishop would have a very blessed year!

There are even stories about doing something similar in Russia even though the rivers would be frozen over, but they would dig holes in the ice so that they might draw water or even dive in!

Let this be a day for us to remember our own baptism and join us more closely to the Lord in hearing the Father's voice.

This weekend we celebrate the **Baptism of the Lord**. It's an amazing event—our Lord, in human form, leads by example the importance of participating in a sacramental life. Jesus didn't need to be baptized, after all, he's God! But it also marks the declaration that he is the Son of God. "On coming up out of the water he saw the heavens open and the Spirit, like a dove, descending upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.'" Our own sacramental life is nourished first and foremost through Holy Communion. Like the Holy Spirit descending upon Jesus, we too become united with him in the Eucharist. That can be daunting to say the least because Jesus actually becomes part of us, and as such we are graced in a way we can only be by God. Makes you feel pretty special, huh?
