Today's Gospel passage follows immediately from last week's. A storm comes up and the disciples ask His help. With a single word He calms the storm.

So frequently we go through similar situations where things get stormy and we need a word of calm. Frequently we can find those words in the Psalms, or the Gospels, or in one or another of the Prophets. I hope that the ways in which I try to apply the scriptures to our own lives is helpful for you. If there is anything that you need me to do better, don't hesitate to let me know. As we continue to get things back to the "new normal" your thoughts and advice are much appreciated.



A NOTE FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY:

Dear Church Family,

This week we celebrate the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time, and the readings are a wonderful reminder of the divinity of Jesus. In the gospel passage for this week, the first of four of Jesus' miracles is presented by St. Mark. Jesus, all-powerful, calms the sea at command, rebukes the wind and then rebukes the disciples as well for their lack of faith. This reading at first may seem difficult to relate to, but really, don't we all lack faith? When the storms of our lives rage around us, do we place our trust in God? Do we accept the reality that God will provide for us—even if it's not as we planned? Lives go through stormy periods, there's no getting around that. I know there have been times in my life when I thought I could bear no more. But you know what happened? I got through those times, and when I look back now, I realize it was God's grace that saw me through. So why is there still at times a lack of faith on my part? Because I'm human. We all are, and as such we need to be reminded over and over again before we truly learn. Don't get me wrong—I do not believe in that old adage, "God never gives us more than we can handle." Some people endure so many trials, but God does not "give" us these challenges. They are just a part of life. For all the sadness we experience, there is also good. The happy and joyous times in which we know God is present as well. I think we should pray for courage to accept there will be dark days and the clarity to understand that, no matter what, God is with us. Our faith tells us that even at the end of the darkest clouds, the sun will always appear. Keep that knowledge close to heart.

Looking ahead: Pope Francis has declared a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly to be celebrated each year on the fourth Sunday of July, the Feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, the parents of our Blessed Mother and the grandparents of Jesus. The Vatican announced the theme for this year is "I am with you always" from the Gospel of St. Matthew, which reminds us of the "closeness and hope that young and old can mutually share." To celebrate this day here in our Faith Community, I am asking grandparents and grandchildren to come together and celebrate Mass with us on the weekend of July 24 & 25. More information will be coming shortly.

There are also handouts there regarding "The Year of the Family" for you to pick up. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has made this quite a year—celebrating St. Joseph, the family and gifting us with a special emphasis on grandparents and the elderly. I say, let's celebrate us all!

On a personal note, it's been so wonderful to see so many of you returning to Mass. The visiting after the Masses went on for quite some time as people lingered to eagerly "catch up" with those they hadn't seen in some time. It was a beautiful sight.
