

The Word of the Laird ...

Today's Gospel passage is the first part of an account of Jesus' activity on one day. It begins with Jesus teaching in the synagogue and casting out an evil spirit. Mark notes that the people were amazed because he taught with authority. Among his contemporary rabbis the custom had grown up of citing previous rabbis. rabbi so-and-so taught..." Mark's account would appear to present Jesus as declaring simply and directly without reference to previous teachers.

Another element in this account is the rebuke of the evil spirit that claims to know who Jesus is, "the Holy One of God." Jesus' response, "Be quiet. Come out of Throughout the Gospel of Mark, Jesus continually rejects affirmation from evil spirits. This contributes to a strain of thought that the scholars refer to as the "messianic secret." This messianic secret was probably an attempt in the early church to understand why people did not immediately put their faith in Jesus and that this developed in the years after His sufferina. death and resurrection. Remember that Mark is writing his Gospel somewhere around the year 50 A.D. So there has been some time in which the memories of Jesus' public ministry were reflected upon by the believing community.

Next Sunday's Gospel will continue with the other events that made up that first day of His open ministry.

A NOTE FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY:

Dear Church Family,

At the beginning of every "New Year" I tend to look back on what was—and, while 2020 is a year I will never forget, it also had moments worth remembering. I've worked in ministry for 21 years, and my position as your FF and YM director has been very different than what I'm used to. Probably many of you can relate as you find yourselves adapting to altered ways of working. For me, sending lessons home, reworking sacramental preparation for at-home lessons, and communication have been the biggest challenges. Yet, in all of it, I've still managed to get to know so many of the wonderful people of this Faith Community, and for that I'm very grateful. The staff (and there's only a few of us) have also been very supportive. I work hard at keeping positive, but that's not always easy. Yet, with the grace of God, we can still find good in life's challenges.

I know the year ahead will also bring its share of trials for all of us, but I believe the trials can become triumphs. It's the perception of our expectations that we need to work on. Many of us worry whether we are rightfully accomplishing what needs to be done—balancing work, home, children and a stinking pandemic—well, enough already! Then, here I am asking you to teach your children at home about their faith. Well, I know you can do this with the necessary tools. I'm working diligently on getting helpful supplemental materials to you that correspond with the Pflaum Gospel Weeklies lessons (which is a great program—easy to use yet filled with important content). Many of you have still not picked up your materials or made arrangements to do so. A gentle reminder to parents that have children preparing for sacraments: The children are required by the diocese to be participating in religious education (FF, YM or Catholic school) in order to receive the sacraments. They also must have separate sacramental preparation. I'm making this as attainable as possible, but you will have to do your part with the lessons. It's not only a requirement, but a necessity! Our faith is something we need now more than ever. Our children need the reassurance that God is with them in all they do. They need to know and experience the Good News of Jesus! I want this for them—and I want it for you. Don't think you have to strive for perfection, just share your faith—make it a part of all you do in both big and little ways. Please reach out to me if I can help in any way.


Give A Spiritual Gift

Advocacy Issue:

Funding for NOURISH NEW YORK initiative

NOURISH NEW YORK is a New York State initiative that provides funding to Food Banks to purchase New York State-produced farm products. This accomplishes two goals: it offers market support to farmers, the fishing community and food processors who have been impacted by the economic effects of the pandemic, while getting high-quality food to individuals and families across the state, through the regional Food Banks, to local parish and community food pantries. The initiative provided \$35 million in funding from May 1 to December 31, 2020. 4,152 farms have provided over 17 million pounds of high-quality New York-produced food to New Yorkers in need.
