## THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

### *The Word of the Laird...*

Today's feast of Corpus Christi (The Body of Christ) came to be part of the Church's celebration in the 1200's. It had been felt that Holy Thursday with its attention to Jesus' suffering and passion did not adequately honor the mystery of the real presence of His Body and Blood. It was in 1209 that the canoness, Juliana of Mont-Cornillon, had visions which prompted her to recommend such a feast. While Pope Urban VIII introduced the feast in 1264, it would be when John XXII (1317) brought about a general practice of the feast with the proper parts of the Mass and the Divine Office being borrowed from the writings of St. Thomas Aquinas.

St. Thomas Aquinas composed a number of poems relating to the Eucharist. The Pange Lingua, in English, "Sing, my tongue, the Savior's glory," was especially used at Forty Hours devotions and the last two verses, Tantum Ergo Sacramentum, was used for Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Here is another of Thomas' poems, Adoro Te.

O hidden Godhead, humbly I adore You  
Who truly are beneath the forms in view.  
To You I bow my heart and bend the knee,  
Since contemplating you all fails me.

Sight, touch and taste in You are each deceived,  
The ear alone most safely is believed.  
I firmly hold whate'er God's Son has spoken,  
Than truth's own word there is no truer token.

God only on the cross was hid from view,  
But here hides deity and manhood, too.  
And I in both professing firm belief  
Make mine the prayer of the repentant thief.

Your wounds as Thomas saw, I do not see,  
Yet You confess my Lord and God to be.  
My faith confirm and child-like trust impart  
That I may love You, Lord, with all my heart.

O blest memorial of our Lord's own dying,  
O living Bread to mortals life supplying,  
Become indeed the life of my own mind,  
So that in you I may all sweetness find.

O Pelican, self-wounding on the rood,  
Me unclean man yet cleanse with your own blood,  
Of which a single drop for sinners spilt,  
Could purge this wicked world of all its guilt.

O Jesus, whom at present veiled I see,  
What I so thirst for grand to me,  
That I may see Your blessed self unfolding  
And may find rest Your glory in beholding,  
Forever and ever. Amen



**A NOTE FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY:**

Dear Church Family,

This week we celebrate yet another of the great Feasts of our Church—The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, aka Corpus Christi. This is yet another Solemnity befitting of our King as we honor Christ in the Holy Eucharist. This truly is central to what we believe as Catholics: The sacraments, the wonderful gifts of God's grace given to us in love, are vital. Most especially, the gift of the Eucharist—Jesus' own outpouring of love divine. *THIS* is why it's so very important to get to Mass as often as possible—to enter into an intimate relationship with Jesus as we receive him body and soul into our heart. It's a gift of profound love, and I personally have an even greater appreciation for it than ever before.

Last year, when the churches were closed and the only way to celebrate Mass was virtually, I became (like so many) sad and despondent. I've always felt the presence of God surrounding me like a light—but what I quickly realized was that this feeling of closeness was cultivated by the Eucharist I received. Without it, I wasn't the same. I know that Jesus was still with me, but it wasn't until I was finally able to return to Mass (and receive Jesus there in person) that I understood the magnitude of what I missed. Relationships need to be nurtured. Good relationships need love, devotion and consistency. I understood this to be even more so in my relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist. This realization proved immense. Joining myself to Jesus in this way is something I will NEVER take for granted again. So, as we celebrate this Solemnity of Corpus Christi, let us pray that we are never parted from Jesus in the Holy Eucharist again.

Crossroads (Youth Group) will gather this Sunday evening, June 6, @ 6:00 PM at the pavilion at Hemlock Park (note the different time and location). Bring a towel or blanket to sit on the ground, and a snack to share but make sure they are **individual** packets – like fruit snacks, chips, crackers or even cheese sticks, etc. following our guidelines please. I will bring water bottles, but if you'd prefer a different beverage you can bring your own.
